Trash Chute Fire Prevention:

Building owners and code officials work together to ensure that the buildings and systems are maintained in order to provide a safe environment for the tenants. And, to also make sure that the passive and active fire protection systems work when needed for when things go wrong. One item that can be easily overlooked is the trash chute and related systems. **It doesn't take long to know that you may have a fire in a trash chute**, as the 9-1-1 center will start taking calls from nearly every floor in a building advising of a fire. 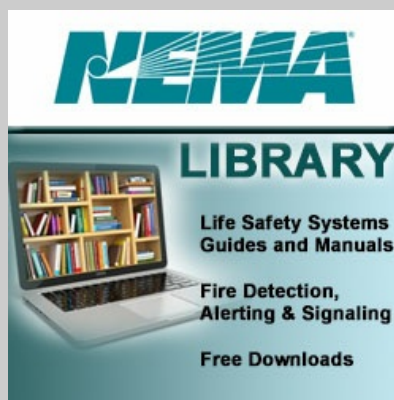
